2019-2020 Assessment Guidelines

The Academy of Leadership and Humanities offers two academic pathways in the following areas of study:

Criminal Justice: Students apply technical information, computer technology, and broad knowledge in the growing field of criminal justice for entry-level positions and continued education. Students develop specific skills in communication, first aid and CPR, human relations, criminal law, and criminalistics.

Marine JROTC: Military science focuses on living the leadership traits and core values of honor, courage and commitment will provide cadets with self-discipline, teamwork, citizenship through leadership experiences, career exploration, and general military subjects.

BCPS Magnet Transportation Information: Chesapeake High School STEM Academy (Southeast Area) Transportation is provided at community pick-up points only for students who would otherwise attend Dundalk, Kenwood, Overlea, or Patapsco High School.

Unforeseen Illness or Emergency: Parent(s) must inform BOTH the school and Magnet Office immediately if the applicant cannot attend or complete the scheduled assessment due to an unforeseen illness or emergency. Please be aware that assessments will not be rescheduled without documentation verifying the illness or emergency.

Inclement Weather Date: Wednesday, January 30th, 2019

Inclement Weather: In the event that school activities are cancelled due to inclement weather, magnet assessments will be postponed. Postponed assessments will occur on the designated inclement weather date. All emergency closing and cancellation information will be posted on the BCPS automated information line, 443-809-5555. Closings and cancellation announcements will also be made through local media.

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Prior to the Assessment

This MUST be completed prior to coming to the audition.

Self-Evaluation: Complete the 2018-2019 Applicant Self-Evaluation form included with these guidelines.

Schedule an Assessment: *Individual assessment appointments must be scheduled no later than November 17, 2018. Schedule your appointment online at the BCPS Magnet Programs' Web site (tinyurl.com/BCPSMagnet) or call Magnet Programs at 443-809-4127 (NOT BOTH).*

Applicants are required to complete a project that demonstrates interest in the program prior to coming to the assessment.

Demonstration of Interest: Students must complete a project, following the guidelines provided (attached). The project will provide the student an opportunity to share his/her personal qualities, experiences related to the academy to which he/she is applying, and future goals. Students MUST bring the project with them to the assessment.

DO NOT submit the project with the magnet application.

Applicants who do not come to the assessment with the required project will not be allowed to participate in the interview process and may be disqualified.

On the Day of the Assessment

The assessment takes about 1 hour.

Assessments are by Appointment ONLY

It is the responsibility of the parent(s) to:

- Ensure that the applicant attends the assessment on the scheduled date and time.
- Contact the schools if scheduled magnet assessment appointments conflict.

Failure to attend an assessment WILL result in disqualification.

Registration Information

Applicants should arrive at least 15 minutes before their scheduled appointment time. Applicants should be accompanied by at least one parent. Applicants will register for the assessment in the Library Media Center. On average, the assessment takes approximately 1 hour. Parents are asked to stay during the assessment. Seating will be available in the school for parents.

If the applicant cannot attend or complete the scheduled assessment due to an unforeseen illness or emergency, please contact Chesapeake High School at 443-809-0100. Please be aware that assessments will not be rescheduled without documentation verifying the illness or emergency.

Assessment Description: Applicants must bring their finished project to the Assessment. A required interview will be administered by a Chesapeake High School staff member. The interview questions will be based on the applicant's finished project. The applicant should be able to demonstrate an understanding of the finished project and answer interview questions related to the selected magnet program.

Documented accommodations, as appropriate to the assessment, will be provided.

Application packets are available at www.bcps.org/offices/omp beginning at 12:00 noon on September 17, 2018. Applications must be submitted on or before **Friday, November 16, 2018**. Late applications are not processed.

You are encouraged to **apply online** at www.bcps.org/offices/omp or **submit a paper application**.

- **Online applications** may be submitted until 1:00 p.m. on Friday, November 16, 2018. To apply online, you will need an active email account.
- **Paper applications** must be postmarked on or before Friday, November 16, 2018.

The magnet academies at Chesapeake High School are looking for students who welcome academic challenges and are focused on their goals for the future.

Think about the academy to which you are applying. To assist you in your interview, create a portfolio or body of evidence that communicates why you want to be a member of this academy at Chesapeake High School.

Use the guidelines below to help you plan your portfolio. Be sure that your finished portfolio portrays your personal qualities, past/present experiences, and your goals for the future, as well as how they are related to the academy to which you have applied.

→ **Personal Qualities:**

- Include personal qualities that you exhibit in your daily life as you pursue your studies, interests, hobbies and extracurricular activities.

→ **Experiences Related to this Academy:**

- Include at least one academic achievement that you were motivated to accomplish (*think about school projects, class activities, awards, etc.*)
- Include at least one experience you have had, past or present that is related to the academy to which you are applying.

→ **Goals for the Future:**

- Identify your career interests and their relationship to the academy to which you are applying.
- Include the goals you wish to achieve and how they are related to your career interests.

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Magnet Assessment Date

All assessments are by appointment on Wednesday, January 23, 2019 between 4 – 7:30 p.m. (Inclement weather date: January 30, 2019 all Academy of Leadership & Humanities applicants will be required to attend the assessment held at Chesapeake High School. Applicants must complete and bring the required “Demonstration of Interest” project to the assessment. Applicants should be accompanied by at least one parent.

Placement Prior to the Lottery

According to Superintendent’s Rule 6400, *at the high school level, where the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of available seats, up to 20% of the seats may first be filled with candidates who achieve a minimum of 80% of the admission criteria and who score the highest scores on the magnet assessments. The remaining seats will be filled using the centralized random lottery selection process from the remaining pool of applicants.*

How to Calculate Your Grade Average

Convert your marking period grades to points (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, E=0). Then divide by the number of marking periods.
